#### 1.) CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 6:31 P.M.

#### 2.) ESTABLISH QUORUM

Three members of the Commission were present which constitutes a quorum. Mayor Montoya and Commissioner Howell arrived during item 6B.

#### 3.) INVOCATION

Commissioner Gomez said the invocation.

#### 4.) PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Benavidez led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 5.) OPEN FORUM

No resident signed up for open forum.

#### 6.) ORDINANCES/RESOLUTIONS:

### a. APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2021-37 FOR TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF STATE RIGHT-OF-WAY.

The temporary closure of state right-of-way is for the Christmas Parade. Commissioner Benavidez made a motion to approve. Commissioner Gomez seconded. At a question about the cost, Sgt. Diaz stated there is an estimated cost of \$4,000 for additional overtime personnel not on duty and the Christmas parade will need increased man power due to the parade being a large event. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

### b. APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2021-38 AUTHORIZRING THE GRANT SUBMISSION FOR BOARDER ZONE FIRE DEPARTMENTS FY 2022.

Fire Chief Campos stated the grant will be used for a pick-up truck to be used in rural areas. Commissioner Benavidez made a motion to approve. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

### c. APPROVAL OF RESOLTUION 2021-39 AUTHORIZING THE GRANT SUBMISSION FOR BODY-WORN CAMERA GRANT PROGRAM FY 2022.

Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez made a motion to approve this item. Commissioner Howell seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

#### 7.) BIDS/CONTRACTS:

### a. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF SERVICE PLAN CONTRACT WITH STRYKER FOR LIFEPAK-15 CARDIAC MONITORS.

Fire Chief Campos informed the Commission that this item is a service contract for the maintenance of the cardiac monitors. The contract has an expiration date in 2024. Chief Campos explained to the Commission the use of the cardiac monitors and stated that the cost is within budget. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez made a motion to approve. Commissioner Howell seconded the motion. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

#### 1.) CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Mayor Montoya called the to order at: 6:30 pm.

#### 2.) ESTABLISH QUORUM

All members of the Commission were present which constitutes a full quorum.

#### 3.) INVOCATION

Commissioner Gomez said the invocation.

#### 4.) PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez led in the pledge of allegiance.

#### 5.) OPEN FORUM

- Ms. Esmer Guerrero expressed her concern regarding agenda item 8F. She stated the City and the School should be separate. Ms. Guerrero added that the City Attorney should be reviewing the agenda to keep the city from potential liabilities.
- Mr. Jaime Castaneda spoke regarding his wrongful arrest. Arrested in donna and judge gave him a gag order and is violating his rights on freedom of speech. He stated his attorney has now filed his suit in federal court. Mr. Castaneda was arrested for speaking out about a pedophile. He stated he will continue to do what is right for the students.

Commissioner Benavidez stated that HB2840 allows citizens to criticize elected officials.

#### **6.) CONSENT AGENDA:**

a. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FOR MEETING(S) HELD SEPTEMBER 14, 2021, **SEPTEMBER 21, 2021, AND OCTOBER 5, 2021.** 

Commissioner Benavidez made a motion to approve. Commissioner Gomez seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

b. SECOND AND FINAL READING OF ORDINANCE 2021-16 TO REZONE MERCEDES MEMORIAL CEMETERY ANIRR TR-E240.85' - W435.85' -N427.46' LOT 1 3.33 AC GR3.22AC NET FROM CLASS "B" TWO FAMILY RESIDENCE TO CLASS "B" BUSINESS DISTRICT.

Commissioner Benavidez made a motion to approve item 6B. Commissioner Howell seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

#### 7.) CITY MANAGER COMMENTS:

### a. REPORT ON COVID-19 MEMORIAL COMMITTEE MEMBERS AND SCHEDULED ACTIONS

Commissioner Benavidez stated he had a meeting with the Committee regarding the placement of the memorial. He added that they are looking at brass as the material. Commissioner Benavidez stated there was no funding allocated but he will be donating \$500 for the project. Commissioner Benavidez stated its important for the people who lost their loved ones to have a place of acknowledgement. No action required.

### b. REPORT ON STREET REPAIRS FOR PUBLIC AWAREMENESS OF SCHEDULE AND PROJECTIONS.

Mr. Hernandez presented an update on potholes. He informed that as of November there were 38 work orders from the 311 app, of the 31, 27 were completed. The potholes that are pending is due to the recent rain that occurred over the weekend. Mayor Montoya showed his appreciation to the streets crew. At a question, Mr. Hernandez stated he received a truck load of asphalt and can last about 2 weeks, he also added that they prioritize the high traffic areas and school zones. No action required

#### c. REPORT ON VACANCIES IN ALL DEPARTMENTS

Ms. Castillo informed the Commission of the current vacancies for each department. The department with the most vacancies was public works which had 7 vacancies. No action required.

#### 8.) ACTION ITEM(S):

### a. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPOINT OR REAPPOINT MEMBERS FOR THE DCM BOARD.

Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez made a motion to reappoint all three individuals. Commissioner Howell seconded. Commissioner Benavidez would like to consider other applicants that can be better qualified and publicize the opening of the positions. Ms. Ramirez stated that each term is 2 years and can stay for 6 years total. She stated that City Hall will receive the applications. Upon a called vote, the motion passed 3 to 2. Commissioner Benavidez and Gomez voted against.

## b. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO PROCEED WITH #PLANTWILDFLOWERS GRANT APPLICATION

Ms. Vidales informed the Commission of a grant opportunity that is available in the amount of \$1000 and is related to the pollination of bees. The grant is due December 31, 2021 and there is no match. Commissioner Benavidez made a motion to approve. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

- c. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE DR. HECTOR P. GARCIA MEMORIAL LIBRARY TO REGISTER THE CITY OF MERCEDES WITH THE FRONT DOOR CYBERGRANTS ORGANIZATION.
  - Ms. Vidales addressed the Commission about a Walmart grant the library would apply to for the summer reading program. She stated the grant is no longer available through Walmart and now would need to register with the Front Door CyberGrant to apply for the Walmart grant. Commissioner Benavidez made a motion to approve. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.
- d. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO DIRECT CITY MANAGER TO REACH OUT TO THE OUTLET MALL FOR CONSIDERATION IN SETTING UP ELECTRICVECHILE (EV) RECHARGING STATIONS (I.E. TESLA CHARGING STATIONS)

Commissioner Howell made a motion for City Manager to reach out to Outlet for EV charging stations. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez seconded. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez stated that there are more electric vehicles on the road now and recharging stations would help to accommodate the electric vehicles. Mayor Montoya would like to look for grants to help rather than just telling the outlet mall to get the charging station. Commissioner Howell stated people will stay while charging and buy from the mall. Commissioner Gomez stated that the Outlet mall is its own entity and cannot force the outlet to purchase it. Mayor Montoya stated that there are grants that may be available. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez asked for City Manager to look at other stores that have the stations. Commissioner Benavidez recommends automotive charging stations rather than include a vendor name in the item. Upon a called vote, the motion passed 4 to 1. Commissioner Gomez voted against.

e. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO DIRECT CITY MANAGER TO COORDINATE WITH WASTE CONNECTIONS TO SETUP A LOCATION FOR THE RECYCLING OF CHRISTMAS TREES.

Mayor Pro-Tem Marinez stated that there is no place to throw out the Christmas tree. There is an area next to the community garden to dispose of and turn the trees into mulch. Mr. Armando Garcia, chairman for KMB informed the Commission of a community clean up on January 8, 2022. KMB will be collecting the trees and then turn to mulch and will be giving it to the citizens for free. Commissioner Gomez asked if there is a cost due to Waste Connections being part of the wording. City has the mulch machine. KMB has taken the initiative to mulch the trees rather than have Waste Connections take the trees. Mr. Hernandez will set markers to drop off the trees. There is no cost to the City. No action was taken on this item due to the City providing the mulch services.

f. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO DIRECT CITY MANAGER TO WORK WITH OUR SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT TO DEVELOP PROGRAMS AND PRACTICES TO PREVENT SCHOOL VIOLENCE.

Commissioner Howell motion to approve and direct City Manager to work with Superintendent to develop programs and practices to prevent school violence. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez seconded. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez stated that there have been several threats and wants to formulate a plan of action. He added that should the City have an active shooter then everyone should have a plan in place and be prepared. Commissioner Howell said this is working with the school district and wants a plan in place. This is to educate the kids and public. He added that it is about working together with the School district because City Police will need to be responding to any calls. Commissioner Gomez stated that the School district is a separate entity from the City and are intruding with the entity. Commissioner Benavidez stated that the package is posted on the website and it states addressing disruptive students. Commissioner Howell motioned to table. Commissioner Benavidez seconded. City Attorney Garcia-Vela stated that this is asking the City Manager to work with the Superintendent and she can say no. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez stated that this is to be prepared prior to something happening. This item is about school safety that all the commission will be on board to keep children safe. Upon a called vote, motion carried to table.

g. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION AS PER CITY CHARTER SECTION 3.03 (CITY MANAGER DESIGNATE, SECTION 3.04 APPOINT ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS, SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY CITY COMMISSION. ASSISTANT CITY MANAGER.

Commissioner Gomez question on the appointment of administrative officer. The Charter states subject to approval by Commission. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez stated that the section Commissioner Gomez is referring to is Acting City Manager. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez read the charter section 2.05 that the Commission cannot dictate a department

head. Commissioner Gomez stated that administrative officers are few. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez motioned to drop the item. Commissioner Howell seconded. City Attorney Garcia-Vela stated that the City Manager is the chief administrative officer. Commissioner Benavidez stated that on January the 19<sup>th</sup> item 13 the prior city manager hired a department head and the commission was not fond of that and it was brought to the commission. He added that there was a policy approved for the commission to be informed of decision. No action was taken on this item.

- h. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION AS PER CITY CHARTER SECTION 3.03 (CITY MANAGER DESIGNATE, SECTION 3.04 APPOINT ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS, SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY CITY COMMISSION. POLICE CHIEF APPOINTMENT (NEW PD CHIEF) No action. Commissioner Benavidez said the commission can make a recommendation but cannot dictate the appointment
- i. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON POTENTIAL NEEDS IDENTIFIED IN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND PUBLIC WORKS.

Commissioner Benavidez stated that on December 9 he had a walk through of the PD and Public Works building. Mr. Perez stated that the needs assessment was done during the budgetary process. During the fiscal year there are assessments due to issues that were not planned. Commissioner Benavidez motioned to get the report together. Mr. Perez stated that there is no issue to report to the Commission. Commissioner Benavidez would like a quarterly report on the needs assessment. Commissioner Benavidez wants an update on the list of needs that were provided. Mr. Perez stated there are critical components to the PD building before doing the remediation. The remediation cannot start until all evidence in the building is secured. Mr. Perez stated that the list of projects was provided at the last or previous meeting to last. Commissioner Howell stated that the staff deserve the best and need the proper resources. Commissioner Benavidez stated that the backhoe was being repaired and didn't see the sweeper, the new vac truck has a more powerful pressure and wants an update of the equipment needing repair. Mr. Hernandez stated that there was only one zero turn tractor and one trailer but with the CO funds the Public Works department was able to purchase more equipment. Public Works now only needs a 3500 truck to pull a trailer which was included in the CO's. Commissioner Benavidez motion to get update on needs assessment for PD and Public Works. Commissioner Gomez seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

j. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CREATE POLICY AND PROCEDURES PERTAINING CITY ATTORNEY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

Commissioner B stated that the city attorney represents the City. This is to create a policy on legal. In the past, there has been reports that the cities got that they are lacking policies and the City Charter does not have all the needs the City may need from the City Attorney. He wants to look at the job description and bring back. Commissioner Benavidez wants to be informed and not run into liabilities. Commissioner Benavidez would like to review current job description for the City Attorney. Commissioner Gomez seconded. Mr. Perez stated the City Attorney has a contract and does not have a job description. Mayor Montoya stated that this should've been done during the contract process. Commissioner Benavidez amended his motion to review the goals and objectives on the duties and responsibilities of the City Attorney. Commissioner Benavidez stated they can look at it down the road. Commissioner Gomez seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion died 2 to 3. Mayor Montoya, Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez and Commissioner Howell voted against.

9.) BIDS/CONTRACTS:

- a. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THE BI-ANNUAL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT 2022-2024, BETWEEN THE RIO GRANDE VALLEY 9-1-1 AND THE CITY OF MERCEDES, POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR 9-1-1 SERVICES This item is a renewal on 911 services. Commissioner Benavidez motioned to approve. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.
- b. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON APPROVAL OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR DIGITAL NAVIGATOR BETWEEN DR. HECTOR P. GARCIA MEMORIAL LIBRARY AND TEXAS STATE LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES COMMISSION (TSLAC)

Ms. Vidales informed the Commission that a signed MOU is needed in order to proceed with the acceptance of the grant. The total amount awarded is \$70000. Commissioner Benavidez motioned to approve. Commissioner Howell seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously.

#### 10.) MONTHLY DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

Monthly reports are included for the Commission to review. No action required.

The presentation included the balance for the departments. Ms. Perez stated that most budgets are on track with the year and provided the budget items that are over budget. Mr. Humberto Garza addressed the commission regarding the grants done by Border Affairs for the City of Mercedes. Mr. Garza provided a handout to the Commission. Mr. Garza stated they review grants, help administer the compliance of grants, grant writing, and project development. Mr. Garza stated many grants require a match and stated that there are funding opportunities for 2022 for parks and added that the City adopt a Master Park Plan. Mr. Garza informed the Commission of the grants the City is currently pursuing. Commissioner Benavidez stated for the record that Mr. Garza gets direction from Administration and the Commission as a whole. Mr. Garza stated that he refers to management prior to doing any work to get approval. Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez stated for the record that he speaks to Mr. Perez in conjunction with Mr. Garza regarding the parks. Mr. Garza commended Sgt. Diaz for his work on grants. Mr. Garza stated that he has a flat fee on his contract and if he would like to receive a percentage, his contract states he will need to get commission approval. Mr. Garza discussed the grants he is working on for the Police Department and the Fire Department. Mr. Garza stated the city is moving in the right direction. At a question, Mr. Garza stated the City pays a monthly fee for his services and added that he has received \$42K since June and does "cradle to grave" with regards to grants. Mr. Garza stated that he is in the business of receiving grants not just submitting and is still pending the return of the grants because he has only been here six months. Mr. Garza stated that in order to get the larger grants like Texas Parks and Wildlife, he looks to make sure the City has at least 80 percent of the funding if it's a reimbursable fund.

# c. PRESENTATION ON REHABILITATION AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE STORM WATER PUMP STATION AT COLLIER PARK PHASE 2, COLLIER PARK PHASE 1 UPDATE, GIS MAPPING UPDATE, & FEMA DOME AREA DRAINAGE UPDATE

Mr. Huacuja addressed the Commission regarding storm water pump station which serves the southwestern quadrant of the City. It will help mitigate flooding in the area. Taking advantage of the existing structures and pipes which saved time and money. Restoring the existing concrete structure, installing two new pumps, pump controls and piping. Mr. Perez stated that the pumps will automatically turn on and off. The pumps will have a float to detect the elevation of the water and turn on and off. The Collier Park Drainage Improvements Phase 1 service area will affect approximately 982 homes. Mr. Huacuja stated that there will still be pockets of water in low lying areas but the pump and drainage improvements will assist with the water flow. Commissioner Benavidez stated that the Commission already voted to have communication with IBWC on the flood gate 160. Mr. Huacuja stated that there has been great progress on the retention ponds and the slop is very gradual and the water will not be stagnant and will flow out. Mr. Hernandez stated they placed erosion control blankets and are looking at laying seeds for grass to grow. GIS Mapping is at 60% to 75% complete for data collection and mapping the storm drainage. The GIS Mapping can be placed on the website to view the piping information for the storm sewer and can be read through a software and can map the pipes out and can be seen in virtual reality. The next item is FEMA Dome Drainage update. The scope of work includes a low point and works in the favor of the city to move the storm water west. They are proposing piping to have a western flow into the ditch to flow north. Mr. Huacuja stated if the ditch is not in place then having a pump to move the water into the floodway to assist the flooding during moderate to heavy rain.

Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez motioned to move to item 10C. Commissioner Benavidez seconded. PU

## AGREEMENT FOR THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF STATE RIGHT-OF-WAY

**THIS AGREEMENT** is made by and between the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "State," and the City Of <u>Mercedes</u>, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its duly authorized officers, hereinafter called the "City."

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the State owns and operates a system of highways for public use and benefit, including Mercedes, in Hidalgo, County; and

WHEREAS, the City has requested the temporary closure of (Texas Ave.), from 600 Block of S. Texas Ave. to the 1000 Block of N. Texas Ave. for the purpose of the 83<sup>rd</sup> Annual Rio Grande Valley Livestock Show Parade, as described in the attached "Exhibit A," hereinafter identified as the "Event;" and

WHEREAS, the Event will be located within the City's incorporated area; and

WHEREAS, the State, in recognition of the public purpose of the Event, wishes to cooperate with the City so long as the safety and convenience of the traveling public is ensured and that the closure of the State's right-of-way will be performed within the State's requirements; and

WHEREAS, 43 TAC, Section 22.12 establishes the rules and procedures for the temporary closure of a segment of the State highway system; and

WHEREAS, this agreement has been developed in accordance with the rules and procedures of 43 TAC, Section 22.12;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them respectively kept and performed as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

#### AGREEMENT

#### Article 1. CONTRACT PERIOD

This agreement becomes effective upon final execution by the State and shall terminate upon completion of the Event or unless terminated or modified as hereinafter provided.

#### **Article 2. EVENT DESCRIPTION**

The description of the Event, including the proposed schedule of start and stop times,

approximate number of people attending the Event, and equipment involved shall be attached hereto and identified as "Exhibit C."

#### Article 3. OPERATIONS OF THE EVENT

- A. The City shall assume all costs for the operations associated with the Event, to include but not limited to, plan development, materials, labor, public notification, providing protective barriers and barricades, protection of highway traffic and highway facilities, and all traffic control and temporary signing.
- B. The City shall submit to the State for review and approval the construction plans, if construction or modifications to the State's right-of-way is required, the traffic control and signing plans, traffic enforcement plans, and all other plans deemed necessary by the State.
- C. The City will not initiate closure prior to 24 hours before the scheduled Event and all barriers and barricades will be removed and the highway reopened to traffic within 24 hours after the completion of the Event.
- D. The City will provide adequate enforcement personnel to prevent vehicles from stopping and parking along the main lanes of highway right-of-way and otherwise prevent interference with the main lane traffic by both vehicles and pedestrians. The City will prepare a traffic enforcement plan, to be approved by the State in writing at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled Event. Additionally, the City shall provide to the State a letter of certification from the law enforcement agency that will be providing traffic control for the Event, certifying that they agree with the enforcement plan and will be able to meet its requirements.
- E. The City hereby assures the State that there will be appropriate passage allowance for emergency vehicle travel and adequate access for abutting property owners during construction and closure of the highway facility. These allowances and accesses will be included in the City's traffic control plan.
- F. The City will avoid or minimize damage, and will, at its own expense, restore or repair damage occurring outside the State's right-of-way and restore or repair the State's right-of-way, including roadway and drainage structures, signs, and pavement, etc. to a condition equal to that existing before the closure, and, to the extent practicable, restore the natural environment, including landscape features.

#### Article 4. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Upon completion or termination of this agreement, all documents prepared by the City will remain the property of the City. All data prepared under this agreement shall be made available to the State without restriction or limitation on their further use.

#### **Article 5. TERMINATION**

- A. This agreement may be terminated by any of the following conditions:
  - (1) By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties.
  - (2) By the State upon determination that use of the State's right-of-way is not feasible or is not in the best interest of the State and the traveling public.
  - (3) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligations as set forth herein.
  - (4) By satisfactory completion of all services and obligations as set forth herein.

B. The termination of this agreement shall extinguish all rights, duties, obligations and liabilities of the State and City under this agreement. If the potential termination of this agreement is due to the failure of the City to fulfill its contractual obligations as set forth herein, the State will notify the City that possible breach of contract has occurred. The City must remedy the breach as outlined by the State within ten (10) days from receipt of the State's notification. In the event the City does not remedy the breach to the satisfaction of the State, the City shall be liable to the State for the costs of remedying the breach and any additional costs occasioned by the State.

#### Article 6. DISPUTES

Should disputes arise as to the parties' responsibilities or additional work under this agreement, the State's decision shall be final and binding.

#### Article 7. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

The State and the Local Government agree that neither party is an agent, servant, or employee of the other party and each party agrees it is responsible for its individual acts and deeds as well as the acts and deeds of its contractors, employees, representatives, and agents.

#### Article 8. INSURANCE

- A. Prior to beginning any work upon the State's right-of-way, the City and/or its contractors shall furnish to the State a completed "Certificate of Insurance" (TxDOT Form 1560, latest edition) and shall maintain the insurance in full force and effect during the period that the City and/or its contractors are encroaching upon the State right-of-way.
- B. In the event the City is a self-insured entity, the City shall provide the State proof of its self-insurance. The City agrees to pay any and all claims and damages that may occur during the period of this closing of the highway in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

#### Article 9. AMENDMENTS

Any changes in the time frame, character, agreement provisions or obligations of the parties hereto shall be enacted by written amendment executed by both the City and the State.

#### **Article 10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS**

The City shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local environmental laws, regulations, ordinances and any conditions or restrictions required by the State to protect the natural environment and cultural resources of the State's right-of-way.

#### **Article 11. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION**

In case one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions hereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.



#### ORDINANCE NO. 2022-

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF MERCEDES, TEXAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A COMMISSIONER PLACE #2, AND A COMMISSIONER PLACE #4, OF SAID CITY; PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF NOTICE OF ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR APPOINTING OFFICERS AND SETTING OUT THEIR POWERS, DUTIES, COMPENSATION, AND MANNER OF ELECTION; PROVIDING THAT NO IRREGULARITY IN SAID NOTICE SHALL INVALIDATE SAID ELECTION; PROVIDING THE METHOD OF HAVING THE CANDIDATES' NAMES PLACED UPON AND WITHDRAWN FROM THE OFFICIAL BALLOT; AUTHORIZING AND INSTRUCTING THE MAYOR, CITY SECRETARY AND THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO PERFORM THEIR RESPECTIVE DUTIES IN CONNECTION WITH SAID ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS AND REPEAL CLAUSE AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MERCEDES, TEXAS:

That an election shall be held in the City of Mercedes, Texas on the first Saturday of May, the same being May 7, 2022 for the purpose of electing a Commissioner Place #2 and a Commissioner Place #4, of said City, such election to be held at the Mercedes Civic Center located at 520 East Second, Mercedes, Texas from seven o'clock in the morning until seven o'clock in the evening, and that notice of the same shall be given by the City Secretary by posting a properly executed copy of this election ordinance and notice for a period of thirty (30) days before the date of said election, or for any period required by law at City Hall in Mercedes, Texas, and;

That the voting at said election shall be by means of voting machines on election day and paper ballots for early voting by mail, and by means of voting machine for early voting by personal appearance. Early voting shall commence April 25, 2022 at the Mercedes Civic Center, 520 East Second, Mercedes, Texas and shall continue until May 3, 2022.

That the compensation of the presiding judge, alternate judge and clerks shall be set per the contract with the Hidalgo County Elections Administrator, the election official who delivers the returns of the election immediately after the votes have been tallied shall be paid the rate assigned as judge or clerk for that service, and shall also return all election supplies not used with the returns of said election. The powers and duties of the aforementioned presiding officers and clerks shall be those prescribed by the Texas Election Code.

That no irregularity in the notice herein provided shall invalidate said notice, and; that any candidate for City Commission may have their name placed on the official ballot by complying with the provision of the City Charter, and with the pertinent provisions of the Texas Election Code, and;

That any candidate for the City Commission may name poll watchers as provided in the Texas Election Code.

That the names of all those candidates who have filed their applications to have their name placed on the official ballot as candidates shall be posted by the City Secretary at a conspicuous place in the City Secretary's office, form and after which time said application is received. Any such candidate may cause their name to be withdrawn at any time from the official ballot before the official ballots are prepared, by complying with the pertinent provisions of the Texas Election Code, and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that the Mayor, City Secretary, and Chief of Police be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to perform their respective duties in connection with said election imposed upon them by this Ordinance, the City Charter of the City of Mercedes, Texas, and the Texas Election Code, and;

That if any section, subsection, phrase, sentence, clause or provision of the Ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or their application to the other persons or sets of circumstances, and to this end, all provisions of this Ordinance are declared severally, and Ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

This notice shall become effective in accordance with Article II, Section 2.13 of the City Charter of the City of Mercedes, Texas.

The City currently uses SeeClickFix (311) for Public Works work management (work orders). To maximize on the software's capabilities and provide efficiency, work orders can be created and closed 100% electronically with a tablet. Data services are required for tablet use in the field.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Public Utility currently uses Sensus SR2 AMI mechanical positive displacement water meters for most residential and commercial water accounts. Lead times on the Sensus meter have been substantial and have caused a backlog of 51 meter connections dating back to June 2021.

The Kamstrup meter is an ultrasonic meter that has no mechanical parts and is an industry leader in accuracy and sensitivity of water flows. The Kamstrup water meter can sense and record flows down to 1/16 of a gallon. These meters are currently in stock to meet the backlog demand.

The Kamstrup and Sensus AMI systems can operate concurrently.

#### SECTION 1.04 EXTENSION OR DETACHMENT OF BOUNDARIES:

(A.) The City Commission shall have the power by ordinances to fix the boundary limits of the City of Mercedes; and to provide for the alteration, and extension of said boundary limits, the detachment of territory and the annexation of additional territory lying adjacent to the City, with or without the consent of the territory and inhabitants annexed or detached. Before the City may institute annexation or detachment proceedings, the City Commission shall provide an opportunity for all interested persons to be heard at a public hearing to be held not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days prior to institution of such proceedings. Notice of such hearing shall be published in a newspaper published in the City of Mercedes, or if none, in a newspaper having general circulation in the City and in the territory proposed to

be annexed or detached. The notice shall be published at least once in such newspaper not more than twenty (20) days nor less than ten (10) days prior to the hearing. However, amendments not affecting the boundary limits set forth in the proposed ordinance may be incorporated into the proposed ordinance without the necessity of re-publication of said notice. Amexation or detachment of territory by the City shall be brought to completion within ninety (90) days of the date on which the City Commission institutes annexation or detachment proceedings or be null and void. Provided, however, any period of time which the City is restrained or enjoined from annexing or detaching any such territory by a court of competent jurisdiction shall not be computed in such ninety (90) day limitation period. Upon final passage of any such ordinance, the corporate limits of the City shall thereafter include (exclude) the territory so annexed (detached); and when any additional territory has been so annexed, the same shall be part of the City of Mercedes, and the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of all citizens, and shall be bound by the acts and ordinances, resolutions; and regulations of the City. Upon the final adoption of any ordinance detaching territory from the City, the corporate limits of the City shall be reduced by the territory so detached, but said territory shall still be liable for its pro rata share of any debts incurred while said area was part of said City, and the City shall continue to levy, assess, and collect taxes on the property within said territory to pay the indebtedness incurred while said area was a part of the City as though the same has not been excluded from the boundaries of the City.

#### (B.) ANNEXATION BY ANY OTHER METHOD PROVIDED BY LAW

Additional territory may also be annexed to the City in any manner and by any procedure that may now be provided by law or that may be hereafter provided by law. Same shall be in addition to the methods hereinabove provided.

#### (C.) EXTENSION OF MUNICIPAL UTILITIES

The City shall within the time limits prescribed by state law, provide or cause to be provided such area with governmental and proprietary services, the standard and scope of which are substantially equivalent to the standard and scope of governmental and proprietary services furnished by the City in other areas of the City which have characteristics or topography patterns of land utilization, and population density similar to that of the particular area annexed. Should the City fail to extend or provide for such extension within three (3) years, the owners of the annexed territory may petition the City Commission to de-annex the territory. If the City Commission fails to act on said petition within three (3) months of the date of filing, the owners may then resort to suit in district court to require de-annexation.
