- Mr. Leo Villarreal spoke to the Commission about professionalism. He stated that the Commission should state facts to get their point across. Mr. Villarreal ended with the Commission should lead by example.
- 5.) CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION RELATING TO ESTABLISHING THE CITY'S INTENTION TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FOR THE PRIOR LAWFUL EXPENDITURE OF FUND RELATING TO CONSTRUCTING VARIOUS CITY IMPROVEMENTS FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS TO BE ISSUED BY THE CITY FOR AUTHORIZED PURPOSES; AUTHORIZING OTHER MATTERS INCIDENT AND RELATED THERETO; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Perez stated that the CO's were tied to infrastructure. Commissioner Howell made a motion to approve the resolution. Upon a called vote, the motion died due to the lack of a second.

6.) CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MERCEDES, TEXAS AUTHORIZING AND

APPROVING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF INTENTION OT ISSUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION; COMPLYING WITH THE REQUIREMENTS CONTAINED IN SECURITES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION RULE 15C2-12; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECITVE DATE.

Mr. Perez stated this is to issue the CO's. Commissioner Howell made a motion to accept item 6. Mayor Montoya seconded the motion. Mayor Montoya stated that if the City does not approve the CO's the city will not be able to improve the infrastructure, parks, buildings, streets, etc. Commissioner Gomez asked about the savings. Mayor Montoya stated that the savings are ties to the city's current rating which is A+. The September 1st deadline does not matter anymore because the regulations that changes will not affect the proposed projects. Commissioner Gomez stated that the Financial Advisors stated that the payment would be for 15 years and waiting after September 1, the years would decrease to 7 years for payoff. Mayor Montoya stated that Mayor Pro-Tem Martinez called in at this time. Mr. Don Gonzalez stated that the list of equipment the city proposed for the CO's will not be subject to the new house bill. He added that neither of the items on this agenda are committing the city to do anything. Mr. Gonzalez suggested to bring item 5 back at the September 7 meeting. After discussion, Mayor Montoya called for a vote. The motion passed 3 to 2. Commissioner Benavidez changed his vote to in favor making the vote 4 to 1. Commissioner Gomez voted against.
