1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Mayor Montoya welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. ESTABLISH QUORUM

All members of the Commission were present which constitutes a full quorum.

3. INVOCATION

Commissioner Howell said the invocation.

4. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Martinez led in the pledge of allegiance.

6. PRESENTATIONS:

a. Presentation from Prime Health

Ms. Kathlene Avila of Knapp Medical Center, in partnership with Prime Health, presented to the Commission highlighting their commitment to quality healthcare close to home. The hospital boasts 227 bids, including 16 ICU bends, and operated a level IV Trauma Center in their ER. With 300 physicians on staff, they offer award-winning care and are the only 5-star system in the valley, also being the sole grade A hospital. They provide detailed metrics on their website to aid patients in choosing the best hospital for their needs.

Their services include advanced treatments like the Mako Robot for precise Knee Replacement Surgery, customized to each patient's body. They've partnered with four surgeons to establish a mid-valley location, emphasizing accessibility and convenience. Mid-Valley Urgent Care, open from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., serves as a one-stop-shop, with plans to offer mammogram days for employees. The Commission commended their professionalism, and Ms. Avila expressed gratitude, assuring the city of their continued support.

a. Basketful's request for donation

Pastor Dillon informed the commission on their efforts of the four churches in found basketsful, a community initiative. They provide food to four groups, each come on separate weeks. Commissioner Martinez motioned to approve. Commissioner Howell seconded. Commissioner Howell inquired about operating hours, understanding they accommodate the elderly by avoiding midday heat. The food pantry primarily serves elderly and non-working individuals. Additionally, the school district operates a pantry for families with children. Pastor Dillon proposed collaboration with the city to expand support to more families. Currently, they distribute \$2,000 monthly to 360 families, roughly. Winter Texans, known as Nomads, assist with light repairs. Commissioner Howell suggested distributing \$20,000 between Basket full and another church. After discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

b. Request for vehicle from Amigos Del Valle

Commissioner Martinez motioned to table to get more details on the van and bring back for the budget. Due to no further motion, Commissioner Martinez motioned to move this item and discuss in executive session. Commissioner Howell seconded. Upon a called vote, the motion passed unanimously. The meeting went into executive session at 7:15 p.m.
